How to apply for rentals with a housing voucher:

Voucher-holders are protected from source of income discrimination, which means a landlord cannot deny you housing just because you will be paying using a voucher or other government benefits.

It is illegal for a landlord to tell you they do not accept housing vouchers, and it is illegal to charge you additional fees because you are using a voucher.

IF YOU FIND A PLACE YOU WOULD LIKE TO RENT, YOU'LL NEED TO:



By email or text, ask if the unit is available and confirm the monthly rent amount.



Set up a time to see the unit in-person and confirm this time in writing.



Ask the landlord for the application criteria in writing.

TIPS ON APPLYING FOR HOUSING

Do not tell the landlord you have a voucher until after you have confirmed the price, application criteria, and scheduled a tour **in writing**.

When you tell the landlord you have a voucher, give them a copy of the Office for Human Rights Guidance about Source of Income Discrimination in Housing.

Landlords cannot ask you about credit issues, late rent, or unpaid rent that happened before you had a voucher. They also cannot ask you about your income, credit score, or lack of a credit score.
